Authorization to Hold Board Meetings by Teleconference in Compliance with Assembly Bill 361

To: Board of Trustees

From: Aaron Arugay, Executive Director

Date: February 10, 2023

<u>For authorization</u>: Consider finding by a majority vote pursuant to Government Code sections 54953 (e) that the Board continue to have teleconferencing meetings due to the dangers posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and the measures to promote social distancing and that have been recommended.

Under AB 361, local agencies can hold meetings without a public meeting space and without providing notice of the board members' teleconference locations if there is a Governor-proclaimed state of emergency and either (1) state or local officials are imposing or recommending measures to promote social distancing or (2) the Board determines that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees. These findings were made by the Board on January 12, 2023.

To continue meeting remotely without compliance with Government Code section 54953(b)(3), must make the following findings every 30 days pursuant to Government Code section 54953(e)(3):

- (A) The Board must reconsider the circumstances of the state of emergency and
- (B) Determine that any of the following circumstances exist:
 - (i) The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person, or
 - (ii)State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

As of February 3, 2023, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has reported 35,325 residents of Los Angeles County have died from the virus.

On February 3, 2023 in Los Angeles County alone, 687 people were reported as hospitalized with COVID-19, along with 1,417 new positive cases and 19 new deaths.

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, in its "Guidance for Businesses and Employers" recommends social distancing including to:

- "Reduce indoor crowding" one example offered is to host, "...meetings outdoors or virtually"
- "Continue, where feasible, to offer telework options for employees."
- "...indoor public settings and businesses: masks are strongly recommended.

If the authorization to meet by teleconference is approved by a majority vote, the next board meeting will also be held remotely unless facts on the ground change significantly. In accordance with AB 361, the ability to hold meetings by teleconference will need to be reauthorized every 30 days.

Recommendation:

Move that the board hold this meeting via teleconference pursuant to Government Code section 54953(e) and find that (i) it has reconsidered the circumstances of the COVID-19 state of emergency, (ii) the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person, and (iii) state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.
